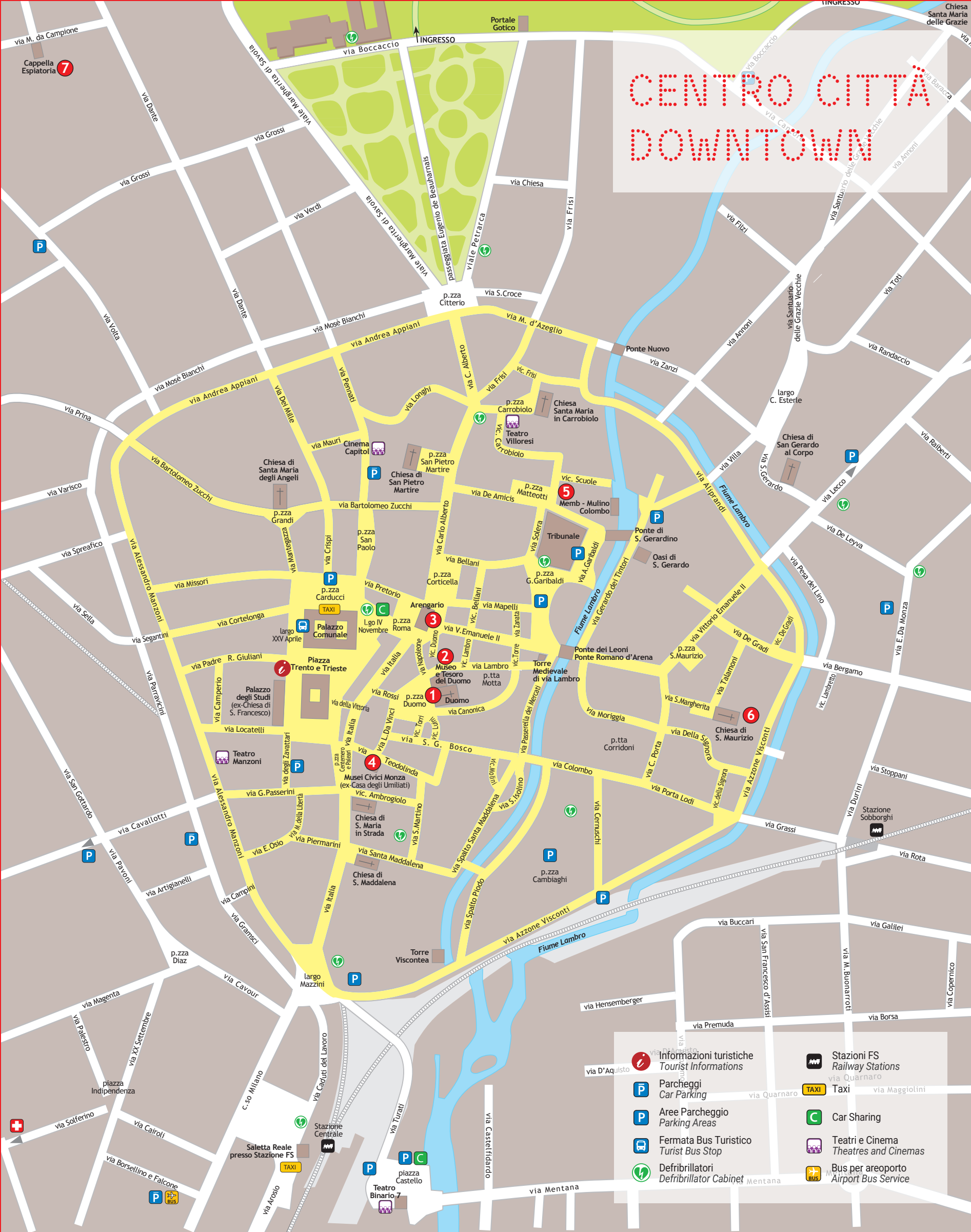

1. DUOMO DI MONZA
duomomonza.it

The Duomo with its gathered piazza, center of the religious life, stands in the heart of the city. The Lombard Queen Theodolinda built in about the year 595 a first building entitled to St. John the Baptist, which will become the present basilica over the centuries.

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2. MUSEO E TESORO DEL DUOMO E CAPPELLA DI TEODOLINDA

The legend of the Regina Teodolinda is narrated through 45 splendid scenes painted in the mid-15th century on the walls of the Chapel of the same name, inside the cathedral. Here is kept the Iron Crown, a precious object and symbol of great importance, used for the coronation of emperors and kings as kings of Italy. Attached to the cathedral is its Museum, which houses a collection of masterpieces unique in the world: from the Treasure of the Lombard kings to works of contemporary art.

The Museums Civic houses the collections of the city, offering a path of discovery that reflects the cultural, historical and social events of the city.

The exhibition unfolds through artworks and archaeological finds which witness the cultural, historical and social events of the city.

5. MUSEO ETNOLOGICO MONZA BRIANZA - MULINO COLOMBO

The Mulino Colombo is a perfectly preserved building of industrial archaeology dating back to the 18th century. Located on the bank of the Lambro River in the historic center of Monza, it is now a museum and exhibition site.

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6. CHIESA DI SAN MAURIZIO E SANTA MARGHERITA

The actual church of San Maurizio was built on the site of the former convent of Santa Margherita that housed Sister Virginia De Leyva, the Manzonian Monaca di Monza dei Promessi Sposi.

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7. MUSEO DELLA CAPPELLA ESPIATORIA
Via Matteo da Campione, 7/A

The Museum of the Expiatory Chapel stands on the site where King Umberto I of Savoy of Italy was assassinated by anarchist Gaetano Bresci on July 29, 1900.

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
